The cause of Crohn's disease is unclear. Previously, diet and stress were thought to be causative factors; however, experts now know that while these variables can aggravate Crohn's disease, they do not cause it.

Several factors are likely to play a role in its development, such as inheritance and a malfunctioning immune system.



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
